Clark Fork Veterinary Clinic now offering Acupuncture and Chiropractic Services!

Acupuncture is the insertion of very thin sterile needles into a point to create a therapeutic effect to allow for normal body homeostasis and allows for body healing. Acupuncture stimulates acupuncture points which are areas of high-density nerve endings, mast cells, small arteries, and lymphatic vessels that release beta-endorphins, serotonin, and other neurotransmitters. Acupuncture works well in conjunction with traditional treatments as well as stand alone. Acupuncture can be very beneficial for muscle soreness, arthritis, lameness, colic, respiratory disease, infertility, and metabolic disorders. Types of acupuncture include dry needle, aquapuncture, electropuncture, and moxibustion. Effects may be seen immediately or within a few days. These effects are cumulative and multiple treatments are often needed. Treatments are generally weekly and take 1 to 2 hours to complete a session depending on your horse's needs.

Chiropractic is an alternative method of healthcare that supplements traditional veterinary medicine. Chiropractic means "done by hand." It is based on the premise that the body needs optimal nerve function to maintain health and focuses on the spinal cord and the nerves that extend from the spinal cord. When the bones of the spinal column (the vertebrae) are misaligned, they place pressure on the nerves and alter their signaling. This condition is referred to as a subluxation by chiropractors. Chiropractic adjustments are performed by hand to bring the subluxations back into alignment and allow proper nerve flow and function. Chiropractic is beneficial for gait changes, performance issues, infertility, behavioral changes and keeps our equine athletes in top shape! Treatments are cumulative and the goal is to reset the sensors in the muscles (mechanoreceptors) so that they hold the spine in a normal position. We should notice improvement with each session. Treatments take up to a half an hour.
